12 STEPS FOR STAYING COVID-SAFE IN CHURCH

1. Enter your details via the QR Code (if you have a smartphone)
2. Pop your mask on
3. Sanitise your hands
4. Have your name ticked off the booking list and collect your service sheet
5. Wait for one of the team to show you to your seat (filling up from front to back)
6. Remain seated, as this will help to avoid the touching of multiple surfaces.
7. Wait to be invited up to communion and keep 2m from the person in front
8. Remove your mask to receive then replace it and sanitise your hands again
9. Follow the one-way system
10. At the end of the service, please remain seated until one of the team say that it's safe to exit
11. Leave church as quickly and as safely as possible
12. Keep your mask on outside whilst saying goodbye and remember to stay 2m apart

If, for whatever reason, you cannot make a Sunday service but have booked a ticket, please cancel your ticket, as this will allow others to attend.

HOW TO BOOK USING EVENTBRITE

1. Go to prescotparish.eventbrite.co.uk
2. Click 'Register'
3. Select the number of tickets, ie, the number of people you are booking for
4. Click 'Register' again

5. Type in your contact details, as well as the details of each attendee. (NB Registration 1 is you, so you will fill in your details again).
6. Click 'Register' again.
7. Voila! You're all done. Your screen should say, 'Thanks for your order,' and if you have entered your email address you will receive a confirmation email.
